New Standards Ahead

God doesn't rule over the dead but is Lord of the living. So the question remains: are we dead or alive? Moses once posed two alternatives at the edge of the promised land: "I will place before you Life and Death, Blessing and Curse. Choose life so that you and your children will live" (Deuteronomy 30: 19). Life means embracing the freedom of the children of God. Death is mere existence governed by the shadowy values of a passing world. Most of us aren't as free as we could be. We're chained to the expectations of a society we claim has no hold over us. We're not yet children of the age to come.

But we can move in that direction. We can stop defining ourselves in terms of material success or failure, physical attraction, popularity and possessions. We can start living by beatitude values, sharing more in common with saints and angels than the faces smiling out of every noticeboard and commercial. Like the Sadducees in the gospel, we may try to impose upon God the petty systems we hold dear. But God lives by different rules and they outlast ours.

How alive are you? What aspects of your current life are "dead" to the age to come?

Time to be roused to new life! Examine one aspect of your behaviour that's been dead to God's rule. Shake off the chains of this age and follow your Lord.

All My Children

There are times when the sceptic in me refuses to give rational assent to religious doctrines, like the Trinity, the Incarnation, or the Resurrection. Thankfully, pure rationality is not the only, and certainly not the best, means of coming to understand deeply spiritual truths. And sometimes my most effective teachers are faithful people who reveal great truths simply by the way they lives their lives.

That happened years ago when a new family moved into our parish, and after Mass a long-time parishioner, extending his welcome, asked the parents, "How many kids do you have?"

"We have four children," they said.

Doing a quick count, the welcoming parishioner said, "I only see three. Where's the other one?"

"Robbie's in heaven," answered the wife, gently. Her husband added, "He died when he was 2 years old".

The parishioner was about to say, "So then, now you have just the three children," but caught himself just in time. The gospel that morning said, "The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob ... is not God of the dead but of the living, for to him all are alive". Clearly so was Robbie alive to his family. Now when I have trouble giving rational assent to the notion of the Resurrection, I think of Robbie and his family, and belief comes easy.

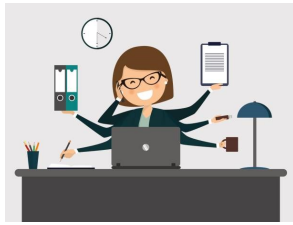

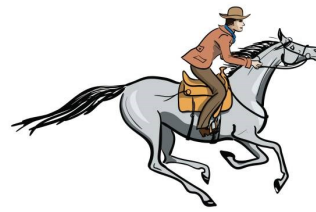


Charnwood Parish Secretary Part Time

A Christian guy named Bill saw an ad online for a Christian horse, so he went to check it out. The horse's owner said, "It's

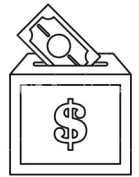
