Sheep are Followers

(Matthew 9: 35 - 10: 9 - 23)

"We are his people, the sheep of his flock". How picturesque - all those cute critters grazing obediently, and I know I'm supposed to want that, but in my heart I'm thinking, "No thanks". Sheep are followers. I'm a terrible sheep. I don't want to follow. I want to control. For example, I want to control my schedule so that I never have to wake up while it's still dark. I want to turn on the radio as I'm getting ready and never hear a pledge drive. I want all the traffic lights in town to turn green as I drive up to them.

But the problem is deeper, and my own life reveals that, especially as I ponder the big things I'd like to control. I want my family to give me my way in everything. I don't want my friends to get sick, or at least to get well when I pray for them, especially the one I keep praying for who keeps getting sicker. I don't want to worry about finances, kids, the environment. I want everyone to practice compassion instead of escalating conflict to violence.

Uh-oh. The real issue here, I see, isn't that sheep are followers. The real issue is that sheep are not in control. Giving up control isn't a goal we can work toward – it's a statement about reality. We can't give up control because we don't have it in the first place! Yes, we must pray and work – clothing the naked, feeding the hungry, visiting the sick and imprisoned. But we must also acknowledge that we don't control the outcome, and we can practice gratitude to the one who made us, whose kindness endures forever, who has placed us in this amazing flock and invited us to serve with joyful song.

Pray

Jesus, you call us to live our faith, travelling beside you, in a world filled with tension. As you bring peace to the world, you also disrupt our peace – turning our lives upside down. May we be reminded of your constant love for us. May we feel your disturbing presence in our lives as a reminder that we are heard, known, and loved as cherished children of God. Amen.

Ponder

Where is your life out of control – your children disrespectful, your health deteriorating, your job unsatisfying, someone in your circle sick or addicted or divorcing? Make a list, and then consider the thoughts and actions that are properly within your influence and those that are not. How would your actions today change if you embraced the beyond-your-control nature or even one of these situations?

Kids' Corner

Many people probably looked at the same crowd Jesus saw that day. But how many of them saw what Jesus saw? Jesus is the Good Shepherd. When he looks at people – even people in a crowd – he looks deeply. He sees what people need.

Jesus calls his disciples to follow him and share the Good News of God's love. Jesus calls you to live as his disciples too. That means seeing people as Jesus sees them. Look at the people around you today. What do you see? Can you look a little deeper, as Jesus does, and see what they might need? How can you help? Lord Jesus, help me see others as you see them. 

How you can contribute to a **SUSTAINABLE LIFESTYLE** in our Parish

On the weekend of **24/25 June** the Parish Social Justice Group will be holding "market stalls" after every Mass that will offer some practical examples of how we can all contribute to a better environment.

Stalls will include information about:

- · the parish community garden and composting
- · what a carbon footprint is
- · a range of options for recycling items that you don't need anymore
- · best practice for use of our kerbside bins
- how to avoid using plastics that often end up in our waterways and oceans.

One of the stalls will focus on the **Lids for Kids program**, which encourages kids to **recycle clean plastic lids from milk, water, soft drink and juice bottles**. The recycled lids are then processed into useful products which stops them from ending up in land fill.

We would love to see our Parish children bring along some clean lids from home to next weekend's Masses.


There will be plastic tubs where you can deposit your lids and, if you are keen, you can help us sort them into their various colours.

Parish Pastoral Council Update

The Parish Council met this week to discuss next steps in the spiritual and community growth of the Holy Spirit Parish in the coming months and years.

We spoke of the emerging youth and young adult movement in the Parish. We are seeing the early sprouts of renewal among this key demographic through Morning Beans and other programs. Most importantly we are pleased to announce we have 10 pilgrims from the Parish heading to World Youth Day (WYD). We thank you for your support for our Pilgrims. As our crusaders, we will be holding a commissioning mass for them on 16 July 2023 before they depart. Join us to wish them the very best as they depart on 26 July 2023 for Portugal. We look forward to hearing about their experiences when they return in August.

Core to the agenda was the rejuvenation of the Parish Council, under Farther Troy's guiding hand, as a voice for the Parish in the diocese and the Gungahlin-Hall community and how the Council should serve as Parish leaders. So we are still on the hunt for those who wish to join the Council as part of that rejuvenation. We ask you to express interest to the Priest and Parish Office before 1 July 2023 and then join us for a discernment night on 19 July 2023 to confirm the composition of the Parish Council going forward.

We also discussed the significance of 2023 to our Parish. This year marks 30 years of this Catholic beacon in the North. To mark this significant and momentous occasion we have commenced planning a week of faith foundation and community events between 15 and 22 October 2023. So please save the date in your diaries and send us through your ideas. More on the celebration will be coming out in July.
