Kingdom Stories (Matthew 13: 44 - 52)

The last few weeks we've been treated with kingdom stories. Some are casual, like the woman kneading dough or the sower going out to plant a field. Some are loaded with suppressed excitement: the merchant finding the pearl, or the discovery of treasure in an unmarked field. What kind of kingdom can be glimpsed from a net cast lightly into the sea, emerging with the day's catch AND a year's worth of junk?

What's clear is that the kingdom of God isn't a simple idea. It's not the usual religious jaunt from a life of good works to a heavenly reward. The kingdom is known through fidelity to small tasks yet holds enormous surprises and can lead to high spiritual gambles. We may be willing to put a pinch of piety into the dough and watch the bread rise. But not all of us will sell everything, even to purchase the brightest pearl on earth. Gamble, with our nest egg?

In fact, every kingdom story has its own risk factor. Not every loaf will rise, not every field sown will produce a yield. The dragnet of human experience pulls up what's useful to spiritual growth and more garbage to haul around. We're choosing, in every minute, how much we will sacrifice, how much to risk.

Pray

Surprising God, is your presence like yeast, or engulfing weeds, or reckless investment, or indiscriminate fishing? As we ponder your reign among us, demand our attention and inspire our service. Alert and revitalised, we thank you. Amen.

Ponder

Bake a loaf of bread. Plant a seed. Go fishing. Invest in something really important. But whatever you do, consider how your actions teach about God's kingdom and how it comes into the world through you.

Solomon was afraid. He would have to lead his people, but he didn't know how. He knew he needed guidance, so he turned to God. Finance Update

Parish Financial Facts That We Need To Be Aware Of That Are Highlighted In The Statistics Below

In speaking to some parishioners, there seem to be a perception that the Parish is still producing substantial profits as it once did in the past, however, this is far from the truth. With the declining mass attendances and reduction of Planned Givers and Pledged Amounts, the "glory" years of the past, where we achieved surpluses of over \$100,000, have truly vanished. As we move from a time of newly constructed buildings and are now entering the cycle of replacement, repairs and maintenance, we can expect ongoing substantial expenditure in this area for many years to come.

In view of this ever changing financial climate, where everyone is experiencing little growth in income and substantial growth in expenses, the Parish is no exception so with known decreases in income and increases in expenditure we have found it necessary to revise our original budget for the 2023 year, which now estimates a small surplus of \$6,812. This is not an attempt to frighten anyone, but simply keeping you abreast of the Parish's current financial position.

Overall, our income so far this year, is a little above budget, however planned giving continues to decline. Other, smaller sources of income, such as the Piety Stall, are providing some modest offset. Expenditure is right on budget for the year to date, but, along with the rising cost of living we all face, we expect to incur higher expenses.

The Voice to Parliament

There is a lot of debate going on about the referendum for an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice to Parliament.

What should Christians do?

We probably need to weigh up the various arguments for and against and maybe pray for God's guidance on what is best for the nation.

The official cases for and against the Voice can be found on the Australian Electoral Commission's website.

If we reflect on how Jesus acted when he was on this earth, we know that he cared deeply about the outcasts of Jewish society at the time. He cured lepers, he sat at a well and talked to a Samaritan women when most Jews wouldn't have given her the time of day. Jesus also ate and drank with tax collectors and sinners, which brought great criticism from the Pharisees. Jesus didn't care.

In many ways Indigenous Australians have been the outcasts of our society. Their life expectancy is lower than for other Australians. The birthweights of their children are generally lower and the rate of infant mortality is higher. Indigenous children are less likely to attend and finish their schooling. The suicide rate among Indigenous Australians is twice as high as that for other Australians. Indigenous Australians are still much more likely to have their children taken away from them. And Indigenous Australians are much more likely to be incarcerated, often for petty offences.

Would a Voice to Parliament make a difference? Most Indigenous Australians think it would (over 80% according to a Yougov poll conducted in April).

At the least the Voice proposal would recognise Indigenous Australians in the Constitution for the first time and acknowledge them as the First Peoples of Australia.

The Voice would also allow Indigenous Australians to make representations to government and the Parliament on matters that have a particular impact on them. Government policies and laws have often been made in the past without reference to the people they affect.

We all need to think carefully about this issue. One possible starting point is to read the Uluru Statement from the Heart which was where the proposal for a Voice to Parliament came from. In fact the Australian Catholic Bishops have encouraged all Catholics to read and discuss the Uluru Statement.

For parishioners who are interested there will be an information session run by the Parish Social Justice Group after 9.30am Mass on Sunday 13 August where there will be a chance to discuss the Uluru Statement and the Voice proposal.
