

Heart for Hire Embrace of Sin

(Matthew 20:1-16A)

RCIA Catholics often report that they feel somehow inferior to cradle Catholics. Having come to the church as adults, they don't share the parochial-school history and inculturated Catholic memories that veteran members of the church have. In the same way, younger people in the church feel left out of the pre-Vatican II store-house of comparisons that the post-conciliar crowd is always using as a reference point. Latecomers in any arena can feel that their presence or commitment is less authentic. They don't have the battle scars to compete for acceptance.



Jesus doesn't hire by the years or the scars, happily, but by the heart. Having heard Mass in Latin doesn't make one more genuinely Catholic, and wearing a plaid uniform for eight years is not a certificate of authentic faith. Punching the clock doesn't make us disciples, but rather answering the call. The vineyard needs labourers. The only labourers who count are the ones whose hearts are for hire, and not just their time.

How long have you been a member of the church? How much of that time have you been authentically invested in a life of faith?

Pray

Dare we venture into the wild places? Wilderness spaces – frozen tundra, windswept outback, tangled bush, jagged mountain ranges, fathomless seas – so much beauty, so much danger, so much uncertainty. Dare we find God present? In painful distress, disappointed hopes, and almost abandoned dreams, listen for the deep and anguished sighs and groans. Yes, God, you are here! Amen.

Ponder

Enter a period of discernment about your call to follow Jesus. Go on a weekend retreat. Seek spiritual direction. Form a support group of friends who share your faith. Listen intently for the direction you're being invited to go. "Here it is again, the Great Reversal: many of the first ending up last, and the last first". (Matthew 20: 16)

Kids' Corner

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways, my ways, says the Lord. (Isaiah 55: 8) "I wish Franklin understood why he has to go to the vet," Jacob says as he sits with his dog in the waiting room. "Well, he needs his shots to stay healthy," Jacob's mum says. "And he'll get a tasty-treat too". Jacob looks at Franklin again. "I know that, but Franklin doesn't," he says. It's a little bit like that with God and us. When things happen that we don't understand, God longs to tell us how much God loves us and that there's a good reason for everything.

WWVP cards

Dear volunteers!

Thank you for your commitment to ministry in our parish. We would be unable to continue to provide pastoral and administrative support to our parishioners and community members without your dedication and support.

It is a requirement in the ACT for anyone over 16 years of age involved in activities with children and/or vulnerable persons to hold a current Working With Vulnerable People (WWVP) card. In NSW the requirement is for anyone over 18 years of age involved in activities with children to hold a current Working With Children Check (WWCC). At a parish level, this applies to parish priests/staff/volunteers active in particular ministries.

Twice a year, a report of all active WWVP card holders is required to be sent to the Institute for Professional Standards and Safeguarding office (IPSS) in the Archdiocesan Chancery, Manuka. Audits are due at the end of March and September and all parishes in the Archdiocese are required to comply. The Archdiocese can be audited by ACT or NSW govt agencies at any time so the audit reports are an important aspect of maintaining accurate records for when an audit occurs.

Our parish is committed to the safeguarding of children and vulnerable persons and complying with Archdiocesan and Govt requirements for WWVP. Please help us to maintain accurate records for the audits by ensuring your WWVP is current.

From 4 October to 28 October there will be an assembly of Bishops and lay people in Rome to advise the Pope on the topic 'For a synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission'.

Cardinal Mario Grech who is the Synod secretary- general has asked that "the entire people of God, in a dynamism of communion, may feel that they are truly participating in the life of the Church'.

Social Justice Message

It is getting towards the end of the Season of Creation.



This week we ask you to think about the third transformation suggested by Pope Francis and that is to **transform public policies** that govern our society and shape the lives of young people today and tomorrow.

We can urge our national leaders to do more about the impacts of climate change. You will have seen the catastrophic effects of wildfires across Europe and America in recent weeks and devastating storms in Libya. These things are not a mere coincidence.

From 30 November to 12 December world leaders will gather for the COP 28 Summit in Dubai. We can lobby our Australian representatives to listen to science and pursue a rapid and equitable transition to end the era of fossil fuels.

World day of Migrants and Refugees

Pope Francis' theme for this year's **World Day of Migrants and Refugees** is 'Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay'. In <u>his message for the day</u>, the Pope says eliminating the causes of forced migration needs a "commitment on the part of all" and also "we are called to show maximum respect for the dignity of each migrant (in) a community ready to welcome, protect, promote, and integrate everyone."

For a decade Australia hasn't heeded the Pope's message to 'welcome and protect' refugees who came by boat. There have been recent improvements, but there is still more to do. Of urgent concern are:

- about 15,000 people who are **not** 'free to stay' safely in Australia, as they live in destitution, unable to work but denied a financial safety net; and
- the people still held in PNG, whom the Australian Government has abandoned in unsafe conditions, with many **not** 'free to leave' there for a safe country.

In the official <u>Australian booklet</u> for the Day, Archbishop Prowse suggests we reflect on our understanding of refugees and migrants, drawing on the flight of Jesus and his family into Egypt. Vinnies calls on Catholics to use the information in this booklet to pray for all migrants and refugees on 24 September.

As well, Vinnies calls for action to help the vulnerable people in our community and those in PNG for whom Australia still bears responsibility.

For the destitute please sign <u>a letter to your MP</u> and help Catholic charities leading support to these people in <u>Sydney</u> and <u>Melbourne</u>, where the numbers are largest and the needs are greatest.

For those abandoned in PNG, please sign a letter from people of faith and a letter to your MP.

Food for thought

Here's a Tip About God

"He replied to the one speaking for the rest, 'Friend, I haven't been unfair. We agreed on the wage of a dollar, didn't we? So take it and go. I decided to give to the one who came last the same as you. Can't I do what I want with my own money? Are you going to get stingy because I am generous?' Here it is again, the Great Reversal: many of the first ending up last, and the last first". (Matthew 20: 13 - 16) When visiting Paris for the first time, I found one custom so different from here or other places I had visited that it made me genuinely uncomfortable: It was tipping. My guidebook told me not to tip the staff that cleaned my hotel room. They would take it as an insult that they were not doing their job well enough and needed further incentive. The same went for taxi drivers and to the infamous French waiters. An English-speaking waiter explained that the French do their job and leave you to eat, not hovering around the table working for a larger tip. That is why we often consider them to be aloof or inattentive, when in fact they are neither.

We cannot possibly reach the standards of perfection we sometimes think God places on us. We fail to realise how generous God is with us. God's ways remain a mystery to us.

So we need merely to accept the generosity of God as God chooses to share it with us. We cannot work harder trying to impress God to get a bigger response from God who is already totally generous. We need instead to be accepting of what God chooses to give to us, grateful and humble.

Go from here with generous hearts: share your gifts widely.

We will use them creatively.

Deepen your faith.

We will learn joyfully and pray constantly.

Build up your faith community.

We will work with others freely and support them continually.

Serve the needy as Jesus Christ would serve.

We will serve compassionately.

We will give thanks appropriately.

Love your enemies, love your neighbours.

We will trust God's love absolutely.

Go from here with generous hearts: God will go with you.


