

Is God Fair?

I have an employee who drives me really crazy. He does nothing I ask him to do; is always late, leaves early, takes endless breaks, follows my directions only when it suits him. Most of the time he does just what he wants to do and is completely ungovernable.

Why don't I just fire this guy? Because, although he does nothing that I ask him to do, he does everything well. He does what needs to be done, and sometimes more than I would ever expect of anyone. Though I tear my hair out about his blatant disrespect for my wishes, I have to admit he's the best I've ever seen. He's like the first son in the parable: he says No but does Yes.

Lots of people say No but do Yes in the reign of God. They don't go to church, baptise their babies, or live by the Book in the way we would like. They don't seem to worship the same God we do, or any God at all. Yet God has a very different abacus than ours, and the tally may come out better for them than for faithful churchgoers who live by the Book but have no love in their hearts. Is this fair? Not while we are pushing the beads, perhaps. But God doesn't stoop so low as fairness, and all kinds of unlikely people are making their way toward the Kingdom.

Conquer judgmentalism! Whenever the little judge pops up in your mind and condemns a fellow traveller, retire it promptly. Watch out for the way the little judge accuses YOU. Show mercy to all, including yourself. "Don't be obsessed with getting your own advantage. Forget yourselves long enough to lend a helping hand".

From 4 October to 28 October there will be an assembly of Bishops and lay people in Rome to advise the Pope on the topic 'For a synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission'.

Cardinal Mario Grech who is the Synod secretary- general has asked that "the entire people of God, in a dynamism of communion, may feel that they are truly participating in the life of the Church'.

So let us pray the following prayer for the success of the assembly in October that all involved will listen to the Holy Spirit in their deliberations and discernment.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.

We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder.

Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right.

All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.

The final week of the Season of Creation What should Christians do about the issues facing the Earth?



Over the past few weeks we have been looking at some of the big issues facing our world.

Some of these matters are dealt with in the Pope's encyclical *Laudato Si'*. Pope Francis in *Laudato Si'* teaches that our faith conviction should motivate us as Christians to assume our responsibility as caretakers of creation.

We all know that people nowadays can be time-poor, with work, schooling and parenting obligations, among other things. We can also feel that we don't have the power to do anything about the world's problems. What can one person do? This is kind of the view adopted by certain climate change deniers in our country, who

argue that nothing Australia does about carbon emissions will have any impact in the greater scheme of things. This isn't true. Big things can grow from small things.

In chapters 5 and 6 of *Laudato Si'* Pope Francis outlines concrete steps and opportunities for dialogue which "can help us escape the spiral of self-destruction. But change is required at personal, community, national and global levels."

Remember the 3 levels of transformation we have mentioned over the past 3 weeks. They can make a difference.

At a personal level you can think about things like: considering solar panels for your home, turning off the lights and heating when you don't need them, recycling as much as you can, thinking about eating less meat, cutting back on food wastage, driving your car less and maybe walking more (apparently walking is actually good for you). All of these things can also add up and make a difference.

I will leave you with a quote from a speech Pope Francis made on 21 August, where he signalled his intention to update *Laudato Si'* to cover current issues. The Pope is quoted as saying "We must never forget that younger generations are entitled to receive from us a beautiful and liveable world and that this invests us with grave duties towards the creation we have received from God's generous hands".

WWVP cards

Dear volunteers!

Thank you for your commitment to ministry in our parish. We would be unable to continue to provide pastoral and administrative support to our parishioners and community members without your dedication and support.

It is a requirement in the ACT for anyone over 16 years of age involved in activities with children and/or vulnerable persons to hold a current Working With Vulnerable People (WWVP) card. In NSW the requirement is for anyone over 18 years of age involved in activities with children to hold a current Working With Children Check (WWCC). At a parish level, this applies to parish priests/staff/volunteers active in particular ministries.

Twice a year, a report of all active WWVP card holders is required to be sent to the Institute for Professional Standards and Safeguarding office (IPSS) in the Archdiocesan Chancery, Manuka. Audits are due at the end of March and September and all parishes in the Archdiocese are required to comply. The Archdiocese can be audited by ACT or NSW govt agencies at any time so the audit reports are an important aspect of maintaining accurate records for when an audit occurs.

Our parish is committed to the safeguarding of children and vulnerable persons and complying with Archdiocesan and Govt requirements for WWVP. Please help us to maintain accurate records for the audits by ensuring your WWVP is current.
