Moses drew the bottom line for the people of God when he presented the stone tablets to them at the base of Sinai: Here are ten things you must, and must not do. Love God, honour your parents; don't steal, kill. Most of us know the commandments well enough to know when we break them, without peeking back at Exodus.

To ask - which commandment of God is the greatest? - is a bit like asking for a hierarchy of evil for future reference. The popularity of lists of sins is that they give us guidelines as to how far we can go in sin before we're over our heads. As Robert Orbin says, most of us would like to be delivered from evil - but would like to keep in touch. The great commandment of Jesus doesn't give us that option. Loving God with heart, soul, and mind is a pretty exclusive commitment. When it comes to monogamy, even if a little infidelity is too much.

How does your commitment to God measure up against the Ten Commandments? How does it measure against the love command of Jesus?

Pray

Love God with all your heart (gesture to heart). Love your neighbour as yourself. Love God with all your mind (gesture to head). Love your neighbour as yourself. Love God with all your strength (make a muscle). Love your neighbour as yourself. We worship God with our whole being (designate your whole body). Love your neighbour as yourself. Amen.

Ponder

Express your love for God this week in prayer, praise and thanksgiving. Express your love for your neighbour, near and far, in concrete and significant ways. "These two commandments are pegs; everything in God's Law and the Prophets hangs on them".

Kids' Corner

Jesus said, "Love the Lord your God with all your passion and prayer and intelligence. This is the most important, the first on any list. But there is a second to set alongside it: Love others as well as you love yourself". (Matthew 22: 37 - 38)

At Mass, Julia looks at Jesus on the Cross and she's sure she can love Jesus with her whole heart, mind and soul every single day. But when she gets home, Julia won't let her little brother play with her. Later, when her mum asks her to clear the dinner dishes, Julia pretends she doesn't hear. That night, Julia looks back on her day. She realises that some of her action weren't very loving toward Jesus. She tells Jesus she's sorry. She asks for Jesus' help so she can do better tomorrow.

Where do you need Jesus' help? Think about it today, and ask Jesus to be with you. (This is a good thing to do every night before you go to bed.)


