Like Leaves In The Wind

I've known several people in the last three years who were told by their doctors they were terminally ill. In each case, these folks immediately made decisions about their lives that they'd been delaying until now. People who know they're dying can't afford to save anything until later. There may not be a "later". There's only now.



The rest of us are kidding ourselves if we think we're not dying: not now, not any time soon, maybe never. When Jesus says, "Be watchful!", we think he means the other guy. We put our faith squarely in "later". Some of us belong to the Church of Later, in which we fully intend to be good, spiritual, faithful people – at a future time to be announced.

Some of us may live to a satisfying old age and wear out with a smile. Some of us will get a deadline from our doctors and have some lead time to prepare. Many of us are left in the dark as to when we'll die or how. This can make us sloppy about the way we live, even arrogant about it. Not taking death seriously is a real mistake in the spiritual life. The church's wisdom is to remind us, right from the start of the church year, that mortality is just what it says it is: a short-term proposition.

Ponder

Resolve to live this Advent season with watchfulness and attention. Miss no opportunity to be kind, generous, forgiving. Resist spiritual laziness with its shrug toward "later". Be a saint in the making right now.

Jesus said to his disciples: "Be watchful! Be alert!". (Mark 13: 33)

A little boy came into the world more than 2,000 years ago to save us all. But Jesus also comes into our hearts every day. We call this a mystery because it's the power of God at work, and we can't fully understand it. But we can be watchful and alert for Jesus. We can notice his presence in our families and friends. We can watch for Jesus in the hearts of people all around the world and even in the hearts of people we don't care for. We can be alert to him everywhere! How will you be alert to Jesus' presence ineveryone during this Advent season?

International Day of People with Disability 3 December

This Sunday is the annual United Nations International Day of People with Disability. It is celebrated on 3 December every year, with a different theme each year. This year the theme is about making the world better and fairer for people with disability.

Last week we celebrated Christ as King but we were told the values the Kingdom of Jesus Christ proclaims are not of power and wealth, but of caring for the smallest and least powerful in the Kingdom. We are called to be like Christ, and to stand with all our brothers and sisters. To feed the hungry, welcome the stranger, to visit the sick and imprisoned. To love them and care for them.

Jesus is always presenting us with opportunities to love our neighbour. It might just mean giving a smile or a kind word or lending a helping hand. People with disability often have many more challenges in their everyday lives than able-bodied people. This is partly because we live in a world that does not always provide fair opportunities for them. So let us reach out to people with disabilities, and both welcome and provide opportunities for fairness, connection and care. And try to reflect on what life might be like for a person living with a disability - to 'walk a mile in their shoes' and remember that we are all interdependent and reliant on each other. Some of us need more support than others but we all need each other, in all our unique ways of being.

God made us all unique, and that is something to be celebrated and cherished. If we celebrate and cherish people living with disabilities, then we must also consider what it means to make the world better and fairer for them.—*Leanne Johns* Please keep the following individuals in prayer.....



Holy Silence

At first silence might only frighten us. In silence we start hearing voices of darkness: our jealousy and anger, our resentment and desire for revenge, our lust and greed, and our pain over losses, abuses, and rejections. These voices are often noisy and boisterous. They may even deafen us. Our most spontaneous reaction is to run away from them and return to our entertainment.

But if we have the discipline to stay put and not let these dark voices intimidate us, they will gradually lose their strength and recede into the background, creating space for the softer, gentler voices of the light. These voices speak of peace, kindness, gentleness, goodness, joy, hope, forgiveness, and most of all, love. They might at first seem small and insignificant, and we may have a hard time trusting them. However, they are very persistent and they will be stronger if we keep listening. They come from a very deep place and from very far. They have been speaking to us since before we were born, and they reveal to us that there is no darkness in the One who sent us into the world, only light. They are part of God's voice calling us from all eternity: "My beloved child, my favourite one, my joy." - Henri Nouwen
