Among the Wild Beasts

The story of the temptation is a wonderful portrait of physical and spiritual realities in juxtaposition. On one side is the desert: dry, hot, harsh, and tangible. On the other side is the Spirit, driving Jesus inward to encounter Satan for a contest over authority. In the end, we find Jesus in the company of wild beasts and angels, in perfect harmony, as if heaven and earth were finally made whole. The lion lies down with the lamb, and an angel protects them both.

Jesus struggles over temptations that appeal as much to the body as to the spirit. Both his physical and spiritual natures must be surrendered to God's will, and it is that surrender which marks the beginning and end of his work on earth. "Into your hands I commit my spirit," Jesus whispers from the cross. His body is already committed.

The image of Jesus with beasts and angels reminds us of humanity's ideal: to be at peace with this world and the next. So long as we neglect our responsibilities to one or the other, we won't know lasting peace.

How are your temptations both physical and spiritual?

We come to you, O God, in this Season of Lent, to reflect again on Jesus' journey to the cross, and beyond that to resurrection. We dare to do that, supported by stories of the many promises and covenant you made to your people throughout history. Come to us in this season, O God, and remind us once again that you're always with us: in death and resurrection, in desert and in flood. Amen.

Ponder

Honour the natural world. Plant some bulbs, take a child to an arboretum, support a wildlife organisation. Honour the spiritual world. Renew your commitment to the spiritual works of mercy. "Time's up! God's kingdom is here. Change your life and believe the Good News."

Jesus remained in the desert for forty days and forty nights, tempted by Satan. (Mark 1: 13)

Jesus is good and loving. So how could he be tempted? Well, Jesus became one of us because he loves us. He shared in our life, and so he experienced temptations just as we do. But he never gave in to them, and he showed us how to resist them too. But Jesus went further. He never hurt those who hurt him. He never refused to help those who needed him. Finance Update

Thanks everyone for your financial support of our Parish. The financial statements show that the parish recorded a surplus for 2023. Overall Income was up due to higher planned giving and second loose collections, interest income and the Piety stall run by the Legion of Mary. We continue to promote the move to cashless contributions, which continue around 70%. We thank those that have already changed and encourage others to move to assist with security and reduce cash handling within the parish. PLEASE CONSIDER and contact Tony Rose in the office if you need assistance. Overall Expenditure was above budget due to new equipment purchases, higher telephone and photocopying expenses. Insurance premiums fell despite having to change insurers. Some planned property expenditure has been delayed.

Readings for 1st Sunday of Lent

Entrance Antiphon | Cf Psalm 90:15-16

When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

First Reading | Genesis 9:8-15

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

Second Reading | 1 Peter 3:18-22

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.

YOU are invited to become a Friend of the Parish Social Justice Group Some of you would know that there is a Social Justice Group in our parish. But you may not know why it exists or very much about what it does.

serving The group was formed about seven years ago by a small group of parishioners who are passionate about social justice issues. The group aims to raise awareness of social justice issues and to suggest ways that we, as a Catholic community, might take action.

The group draws on Catholic social justice teachings that promote human dignity and the common good in society. **The World Day of Social Justice is coming up on 20 February**. It is a day for remembering the various social justice issues affecting our world today.

Why should you care?

It is the responsibility of all Christians to care about their fellow human beings and about our common home - the planet.

So we all need to care about things like:

- People suffering from poverty and homelessness;
- The impacts of climate change, which impact on the poor more than anyone else;
- The refugees and asylum seekers of the world;
- Modern day slavery and oppression;
- Our aboriginal brothers and sisters who are still not benefiting from the Closing the Gap policy agreed to by all Australian governments.

When the time comes Jesus will ask every one of us:

- When I was hungry did you feed me?
- When I was thirsty did you give me a drink?
- When I was naked did you clothe me?
- When I was a stranger did you welcome me?
- When I was sick or in prison did you visit me?

How will we be able to answer?

So what can you do?

During the coming year the Parish Social Justice Group will continue to remind you about social justice issues and small things you might do to help address them. It might be that you support organisations who advocate for social justice, like the St Vincent de Paul Society, Caritas Australia, Catholic Missions, the Salvation Army, Red Cross, or similar organisations. Or there might be a local project that you can contribute to.

You may not have the time to join the Social Justice Group and attend its meetings. We understand that people have other obligations and families to look after. But if you have an interest in social justice issues you may be able to find the time to help with particular projects that the Group sponsors.

On the weekend of 17/18 February we invite you to register your interest in particular activities or issues that you might get involved in. We are hoping to build a register of parishioners who are willing to help us in raising awareness of social justice issues and doing something about them.

We would love you to consider joining us in some of our activities this year.
