Believing is Seeing

Believing is seeing. We are taught it's the other way around: seeing is supposed to be believing. But we see a lot of things we don't believe. We see how old we are in the mirror and pretend the truth away with hair colour and makeup. We see injustices and rationalise them into sounding all right. We live as in George Orwell's classic novel 1984, in which the news is



rewritten daily to conform to the preferences of the powerful. "Facts" are more fluid than we care to admit. Many are convinced, not by what they see, but by what makes us all comfortable.

So it seems the reverse is true: believing is seeing. Our beliefs tell us how to see. They tell us what to look for. Faith gives us eyes to see what others may be blind to. The worldly view is cynical: things are bad and getting worse, and not much can be done. But through believing, we see the Kingdom coming, arriving as an invitation to grace in every hour. Believers have hope, which heals the past and invents the future. That's why, though we have not literally seen Jesus, we can believe in him, and in believing, we can truly see.

What have you seen through faith that you might have missed with your eyes?

Loving God, when we are frightened and filled with doubts ... open us to the gospel of peace. When we think we understand everything and our minds are closed to new teachings ... open us to the gospel of peace. When we do not understand, and our fears turn into anger or mistrust ... open us to the gospel of peace. When we want to hide behind laws, regulations, and traditions that can hurt and exclude ... open us to the gospel of peace. As the risen Christ came to be with the disciples and show them new possibilities ... open us to the gospel of peace. Amen.

Ponder

Reflect on a situation in your life that has seemed hopeless: a broken relationship, a bitter disappointment, a missed opportunity, an irredeemable loss. Looking at it through the eyes of faith. See what Jesus sees: the never-ending chance for healing and life. "Even better blessings are in store for those who believe without seeing."

Kids' Corner

Now I know, sisters and brothers, that you acted out of ignorance, just as your leaders did. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away. (Acts 3: 17, 19)

Have you ever done something you thought was so bad no one could forgive you? Almost everyone has. Peter was once so frightened that he pretended not to know Jesus. When he thought about what he'd done, he wept. And here Peter is again, speaking to the people who once cried out these words: "Crucify him!" Peter knows they can be forgiven just as he was, if only they will ask. Remember, God is merciful.

Readings for 2nd Sunday of Easter

Entrance Antiphon | 1 Peter 2:2

Like newborn infants, you must long for the pure, spiritual milk,

that in him you may grow to salvation, alleluia.

First Reading | Acts of the Apostles 4:32-35

The whole group of believers was united, heart and soul; no one claimed for his own use anything that he had, as everything they owned was held in common.

The apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus with great power, and they were all given great respect.

None of their members was ever in want, as all those who owned land or houses would sell them, and bring the money from them, to present it to the apostles; it was then distributed to any members who might be in need.

Responsorial Psalm | Ps 117:2-4. 15-18. 22-24. R. v.1

- (R.) Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting.
- Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.' Let the sons of Aaron say: 'His love has no end.' Let those who fear the Lord say: 'His love has no end.' (R.)
- The Lord's right hand has triumphed; his right hand raised me up.
 I shall not die, I shall live and recount his deeds.
 I was punished, I was punished by the Lord, but not doomed to die. (R.)

Second Reading | 1 John 5:1-6

Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has been begotten by God;
and whoever loves the Father that begot him loves the child whom he begets.
We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us;
this is what loving God is – keeping his commandments;
and his commandments are not difficult,
because anyone who has been begotten by God has already overcome the world;
this is the victory over the world – our faith.
Who can overcome the world?

Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God;

Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only, but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness – since the Spirit is the truth.

Gospel Acclamation | John 20:29

Alleluia, alleluia!

- You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me;
- happy are those who have not seen me, but still believe! Alleluia!

Gospel | John 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

"Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained."

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
