#### Touch Me and See

I saw Jesus earlier this morning. At Mass, a colourfully dressed man with a very challenging smell sat next to me in the pew. I've seen him in our parish before. He seemed to have a mental disability, and though he's not disruptive to the liturgy, he exhibits his oddity in his appearance and by virtue of the colouring book he studies while the Mass is going on. At the sign of peace today, I extended my hand to him in Christian charity, and at the same time he reached out to me with both arms outstretched. For a split second we hovered in the air around each other, wavering



between a handshake and an embrace. In that same second, I had to make all kinds of decisions about hygiene and ritual and personal boundaries and kissing lepers – the same choices Saint Francis had to make when a leper met him on the road one day.

When I finally took him in my arms, I was braced for something wretched to happen. It didn't. He touched me with as much reverence and gentleness as one might take up a small child. And when we parted, he gave me a tiny, shy smile of thanks. It was as good as communion.

#### How do you know when you encounter Jesus along the way?

Your friends are frightened and upset. They didn't know what was going to happen next. You came to them, to show them you were there for them. Loving Jesus, be there for us. Your friends were mixed up, and not sure what to think. You showed them your hands and feet, and shared a meal with them. Loving Jesus, share with us. Your friends were happy, but they didn't know what to do. You talked to them and taught them, and told them the story of God's love. Loving Jesus, tell us the story too. Amen.

#### **Ponder**

Consider the gift of touch and how the Church uses it in blessing. Look for ways to bring the blessing of human touch to those most in need of it. "You're the first to hear and see it. You're the witnesses."

#### Kids' Corner

Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. (John 6: 11)

Say you're one of Jesus' disciples, and you've got 5,000 hungry people staring at you. All you have are a few loaves of bread – each about the size of a hamburger bun – and two pieces of fish. You ask Jesus for help and ... what's he doing? Giving thanks? "Uh, Jesus how can you be thankful right now? Shouldn't you be asking for more?" Then Jesus smiles, and suddenly, there's more than enough food to go around. Jesus has fed everyone.

#### Readings for 3rd Sunday of Easter

#### Entrance Antiphon | Cf Psalm 65:1-2

Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise, alleluia.

#### First Reading | Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15. 17-19

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate, after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses.

'Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.'

#### Responsorial Psalm | Ps 4:2. 4. 7. 9. R. v.7

(R.) Lord, let your face shine on us.

- When I call, answer me, O God of justice; from anguish you released me, have mercy and hear me! (R.)
- 2. It is the Lord who grants favours to those whom he loves:

#### Second Reading | 1 John 2:1-5

I am writing this, my children, to stop you sinning; but if anyone should sin, we have our advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, who is just; he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, but the whole world's. We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments. Anyone who says, 'I know him', and does not keep his commandments, is a liar, refusing to admit the truth. But when anyone does obey what he has said, God's love comes to perfection in him.

#### Gospel Acclamation | See Luke 24:32

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, make your word plain to us: make our hearts burn with love when you speak. Alleluia!

#### Gospel | Luke 24:35-48

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

#### Jesus Heals our Pains

How are we healed of our wounding memories? We are healed first of all by letting them be available, by leading them out of the corner of forgetfulness, and by remembering them as part of our life stories. What is forgotten is unavailable and what is unavailable cannot be healed.... By lifting our painful forgotten memories out of the egocentric, individualistic, private sphere, Jesus Christ heals our pains. He connects them with the pain of all humanity, a pain he took upon himself and transformed. To heal, then, does not primarily mean to take pains away but to reveal that our pains are part of a great pain, that our sorrows are part of a great sorrow, that our experience is part of the great experience of him who said, "But was it not ordained that the Christ should suffer and so enter into the Glory of God?" (Luke 24:26).

# **Archdiocesan Assembly**

Archbishop Christopher Prowse has asked for an Archdiocesan Assembly on 18-20 October 2024. The Assembly is the Archdiocese's initial response to the recent Australian Plenary Council. Preparations are underway and further information is available at <u>cgevangelisation.org.au</u>

The Archdiocese is currently holding a series of "roundtables" on particular themes. The discussion at the roundtables will feed into the Assembly. Several roundtables have been held and the next Roundtables are on this coming week:



Expanding the Tent: Multicultural and Ecclesial Communities on Tuesday 16 April and Moments of Encounter: Sacramental Initiation on Thursday 18 April. The roundtables occur from 4:30pm - 6:00pm and are held at the St Christopher's Pastoral Centre in Manuka and can also be attended by zoom. Registrations are through the website above. Several members of Holy Spirit Parish including Fr Troy are attending next week's roundtables.

In addition, Archbishop Prowse has asked Parishes, schools and communities to consider at a local level what can be shared at the Assembly in October. Holy Spirit Parish led by Fr Troy will commence shortly with some events to consider our particular issues in Gungahlin in the context of the themes of the Plenary Council and the Roundtables.
