### The Stone Rejected

Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd would die for the sheep. The hired hand, who is neither shepherd nor owner of the sheep, catches sight of the wolf coming and runs away, leaving the sheep to be scattered or snatched by the wolf. That's because the hired hand works only for pay and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me." (John 10: 11 - 14)

The portrait of Jesus in John's gospel is unique for many reasons. Ninety percent of the stories in John don't appear in the other three gospels. And the stories that do appear always lean in the direction of glory. Jesus walks taller in John's version of things. Jesus never wears swaddling clothes as a helpless babe in a manger. He's always in control, from the dawn of creation as the Divine Word who became flesh for our sake, to the Lordly way he debates the nature of authority with Pontius Pilate. In the garden of Gethsemane, John's Jesus shows no agony, does not weep or sweat blood. From the cross he doesn't cry out about abandonment, nor surrender his spirit. Instead, he offers the regal declaration, "It is finished," as he retires his mission.

It's not surprising that Jesus doesn't assume the role of sacrificial victim in describing his relationship to the cross, which he foresees and predicts. John's Jesus is never seized in the garden; when the mob tries to lay hands on him, they fall to the ground. Judas dares not kiss his way into betrayal. Rather, Jesus agrees to enter into custody and marches to the cross in perfect freedom. He's not handed over like a prisoner but chooses the cross as Lord of history. This stone, rejected by human arrogance, is the undisguised Rock of Ages. Lord have mercy on those who had eyes and didn't see!

#### Pray

You are the Good Shepherd, and we are your sheep. We come in all shapes and sizes, all colours, personalities, quirks, and possibilities. In your generous welcome, you open wide the gates of community so all can gather in and know your love. You gently remind us that not all your people are present. Some are absent because of health, some because of other obligations, and some have been kept out intentionally and unintentionally. Through your prophetic words bring us back to your way of hospitality where all are enfolded in love. Amen.

### **Ponder**

Find images of Jesus in your church or in art that reveal him as the stone rejected by humanity and as the Son of God who lays his life down freely. Contemplate each image in prayer. Consider how your prayer is shaped by each portrayal.

### Kids' Corner

The moment Steven saw Digby, he knew the little beagle was the right dog for him. But Digby hadn't had a happy life. His previous family didn't know how to care for him and had brought Digby back to the shelter. Steven promised Digby he would never do that. But it wasn't easy. Digby was fearful and skittish. Steven and his dad talked to their veterinarian and a dog trainer to get help. It took months of patience, but today, Digby is a happy dog. I think it's because he trusts that his family will never leave him. What do you think?

### Readings for 4th Sunday of Easter

### Entrance Antiphon | Cf Psalm 32:5-6

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

### First Reading | Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence, today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

### Second Reading | 1 John 3:1-2

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are.

Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us.

My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed:

all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is.

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me. Alleluia!

### Gospel | John 10:11-18

Jesus said:

'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father: and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice. and there will be only one flock and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

### Violence can be random and unexpected with devastating outcomes for the victims and their loved ones.

As we saw in Sydney, five women and a man were simply in the wrong place at the wrong time when they lost their lives at a shopping mall. When dealing with such tragedies, Christians and people of other faiths seek solace in praying. Through prayer, we try to find answers to the 'incomprehensible' nature of the event that has taken place. The man responsible for the attack reportedly had had a long history of mental health issues, including schizophrenia. Mental health can be complex, and we will probably never know why this individual did what he did. It is important, however, not to demonise all those who suffer with these conditions. Most of us have a family member, relative or friend who has suffered or continues to suffer from a mental health issue. For people who struggle with their mental health, they are often living a private hell and pose little risk to others. Therefore, they need to be embraced and not shunned. In the words of Pope Francis who has spoken a number of times about the importance of solidarity and friendship, "Let us dream, then, as a single human family, as fellow travellers sharing the same flesh, as children of the same earth which is our common home, each of us bringing the richness of his or her beliefs and convictions, each of us with his or her own voice, brothers and sisters all." "The bible says whoever finds a friend has found a treasure. I would like to invite everyone to go beyond their groups of friends and build social friendship which is so necessary for living together well."

For all those affected by violence, we pray..... Dear Lord, you know the anguish of the sorrowful, you are attentive to the prayers of the broken-hearted. Hear your people who cry out to you in their need; strengthen their hope in your lasting goodness. We pray today for those who have died because of violence. Draw them to yourself; let your face shine upon them. May they be greeted with choirs of angels and experience your eternal peace and joy. Be near to all those who have been touched by violence: those who have been hurt, lost their loved ones or lost their sense of security. Be for them a steady comfort and safe resting place. Soften the hearts and steady the minds of those who would do violence to others. May hate be replaced with love, violence with peace and darkness with your light. Amen.— Source: Majellan Media.
