God Is Greater than Our Hearts

"He must increase; I must decrease." John the Baptist once used these words to describe his relationship to Jesus. John, we understand, was a pretty impressive character. He was such a charismatic speaker that multitudes sought his baptism, listened to his levelling criticisms of popular culture and values, and vowed radical changes as a result of encountering him. John was a prophet and guru with his own circle of disciples. When Jesus appeared on the scene, John might have viewed him as a rival.

Instead, John responds with extraordinary humility. He acknowledges that Jesus is greater. And not only greater: John admits that Jesus replaces him altogether. John's mission is complete the hour Jesus arrives. As Jesus ascends, John will fade away. John doesn't lament this. He states this fact is obvious and right.

This is the relationship of the vine to the branches. The vine survives the trimming of its branches, but the branches do not survive without the vine. The vine is more enduring, the very source of life. The branches play their part in relationship to the vine. It's folly for a branch to forget what it is. But in service to the vine, it bears much fruit.

Define yourself as a branch attached to Jesus the vine. Name the fruit you bear in this relationship.

Pray

We praise you – you who planted us in this life, and eternally tend us as your own. Graft us into your spirit that we may be bound together and held and affirmed as one community in your love. Nourish us with your compassion and prune us with your truth until we are one people, abiding always in you and growing in love. Easter God, you are the vine-keeper, and we praise you – you who grafts us into yourself and calls us your own. May we be your Easter people, bearing the fruit of resurrection faith. Amen.

Ponder

Consider your attachment to Jesus the vine: is it weak, strong, in need of support? Resolve to strengthen the bond in prayer and imitation.

Kids' Corner

Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord. (Acts 9: 27)

Everyone knew Saul was trouble. He'd been arresting Jesus' followers and getting them thrown in jail. So when people heard that Saul changed his mind about Jesus and was going by a different name, Paul, they were unsure and afraid. How could they trust him? But Barnabas took the risk of trusting Paul. He'd heard Paul telling the story of how he'd been blinded and how Jesus spoke to him and cured him. Barnabas could see that Paul spoke truthfully and he defended Paul. Do you know someone like Paul, who needs a friend to stand up for them? Will you be a good friend, like Barnabas?

Readings for 5th Sunday of Easter

Entrance Antiphon | Cf Psalm 97:1-2

O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

First Reading | Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

Responsorial Psalm | Ps 21:26-28. 30-32. R. v.26

- (R.) I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.
- My vows I will pay before those who fear him. The poor shall eat and shall have their fill. They shall praise the Lord, those who seek him. May their hearts live for ever and ever! (R.)
- 2. All the earth shall remember and return to the Lord,

all families of the nations worship before him. They shall worship him, all the mighty of the earth; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust. (R.)

3. And my soul shall live for him, my children serve him.

They shall tell of the Lord to generations yet to come,

declare his faithfulness to peoples yet unborn: 'These things the Lord has done.' (R.)

Second Reading | 1 John 3:18-24

My children,

our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are the children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence, whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he

knows everything.

My dear people,

if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence,

and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants. His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to. Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

Gospel Acclamation | John 15:4-5

Alleluia, alleluia! Live in me and let me live in you, says the Lord; my branches bear much fruit. Alleluia!

Gospel | John 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away - he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit,

and then you will be my disciples.'

Communion Antiphon | Cf John 15:1,5

Jesus, the Centre

Without some centre of unity, groups lose their way. A team which puts its eyes on money rather than on teamwork will lose games. A family which relies on anything other than love to keep it together will fall apart. The church, the community of Jesus is something similar.

What keeps the church together at its best is Jesus. Human leadership, moral authority, ritual dogmatism, are not the centre of the church. Leadership can fail, moral authority can take wrong turnings and ritual dogmatism can override the concerns of people. The centre of the church is Jesus Christ. Our unity with Jesus is the central bond of the church. He is the Vine, we the branches.

When we have been let down by the church, like in the situations of abuse, or cover-ups by church authority, we are kept going as Christians by our unity with Jesus.

The image of roots and branches, of fruit and tree, all very much part of each other, is what Jesus uses. Other images like this might be the unity or light and colour in a rainbow, or of
