What Happens Next?

"Time to go." We all know what that means. If you come from a family like mine, it means we're now entering into a period of goodbyes that make us loiter in the doorway for another half hour. Sooner or later, though, we're going to finish that final conversation, give that last hug, say the last I-love-you, and wish the travellers a safe journey home. And then they're gone. For a moment, there's an almost visible space in the room shaped just like Aunt Ida and the kids. That same shaped emptiness is curiously echoed in the heart. Even the silence sounds curiously like the folks who just left.

The disciples standing around after the Ascension must have experienced something like that. A Jesus-shaped space where he stood, a Jesus-sounding silence where he'd spoken. There was a space in their hearts, too, that they would always long for him to fill. And yet the same must have been true of them as it is for us when we take leave of loved ones. Their presence remains brilliantly in their absence. They're not here but are hardly gone for good. You can't kill love off that easily. Love never leaves the room.

How do you keep Jesus close even when he may seem absent?

Pray

God of all wisdom, give us visions of the life you intend for us. Make your ways our ways. Guide us in building a Spirit-led community that bears fruit which is pleasing to you and beneficial to our neighbours. Amen.

Ponder

Consider the Jesus-shaped place in your life. Is it big enough, profound enough, life-changing enough? Reflect on ways to expand it. The church, you see, is not peripheral to the world; the world is peripheral to the church.

Kids' Corner

Jesus performed a lot of miracles. He walked on water, healed the sick and even raised the dead. He did these signs to show people that he was the Son of God who loved them. When Jesus left the earth and ascended into heaven, he continued to do miracles through his disciples. After all, he had given them a big job: to convert the whole wide world! Miracles still happen through Jesus today. They may not always look like what you read in the Gospel stories, but they are there. Keep your eyes open for miracles. They show us that God is with us.

Greetings all,

Just writing to update everyone on the latest considerations from your Parish Council. We met this week to discuss next steps in the parish.

We would like to begin with a thanks to Frances and Jim for the Call to Ministry last weekend. It was only the beginning of a month of calling you to ministry. Please consider volunteering for one of our ministries so that we can continue to flourish in faith as part of the global church. Volunteer forms are in the Church foyer.

The most significant step is our participation in the Archdiocese Assembly in October 2024. The Assembly is an action coming from the Plenary Council in 2022. In preparation for this Assembly, the Archdiocese has been holding listening sessions and workshops to shape the core questions we the parishioners have for the Archdiocese and we need to answer for the Archbishop. You are encouraged to join these Archdiocese workshops if you can. However as a parish, we plan to hold a multitude of preparatory meetings, lunches, dinners, prayer sessions and roundtables to prepare parishioners and the parish for the Assembly and for our own Parish Assembly in 2025. In the coming months you will be invited by Fr Troy and the Council, through the bulletin, the website and Parish App to contribute and attend these meetings, prayer sessions and roundtables to provide your input on how we can grow in faith.

The other major parish initiative is our Parish Feast Day on Pentecost next weekend. There is more information in this bulletin on the celebration after the 9:30am Mass. Please come along and celebrate the Parish and the richness each and everyone of you brings from your language, family, culture and your faith to our Parish. Much like the Holy Spirit did at that first Pentecost. We will also be hosting a wine and cheese gathering post Saturday night Mass on 18 May 24 as a way for as many of us to celebrate the Parish Feast Day.

If you have about 45min on Saturday 18 May 24 at 9am to help us dress the Parish for the Feast Day we would be grateful for your assistance.

Finally in the coming months we will be advertising for parishioners to join the Parish Pastoral Council. More detail will come out in the next two months but please consider joining the Council to help us to continue to flourish in our community as part of the global church.

The Holy Spirit needs your help! Well actually, Holy Spirit Parish needs your help.

Holy Spirit Parish has been relatively blessed throughout the past 30 years with participation in ministries. In general, each mass has sufficient numbers of rostered individuals and/or volunteers willing to help out on-the-spot when asked, allowing at a minimum for the mass to run without crucial interruptions.

Following the pandemic, the overall numbers of parishioners attending mass has been lower, which in turn has affected the number of people participating in ministries. It is becoming common for the same people to perform ministries every week, for people to fill multiple ministries in the same mass, or for some ministries to not be filled at all.

The Parish ministries are varied and there are opportunities for young and old to become involved. Some include behind the scenes work, helping with mass, ensuring we have chairs to sit on and looking after the buildings and grounds for example. Volunteering to help with a ministry is also a great way to meet other Parishioners.

Through May, the Parish is seeking your interest in volunteering for any of the ministries. More detailed information will be available on the Parish web site about the various Ministries and how you can register interest.

The St Vincent de Paul Society needs you

We all know that the cost of living in Australia is going up. Correspondingly, the number of people calling on the St Vincent de Paul Society for help is doing the same.

People are struggling to pay bills and put food on the table. Sometimes they have to make choices about doing either one or the other.

In our parish the local St Vincent de Paul Conference has seen a large increase in calls for assistance. On one day alone in January we had 23 calls for assistance. While that was exceptional, following the Christmas break, it is not uncommon for us to get 6 or more calls a day. In fact we get more calls for help than any other parish in Canberra. On average we would get 20 or more calls each week. People call us because they need food or clothing or help with bills.

Some of you may recall that I spoke at weekend Masses late last year and asked people to think about joining us in our work. We were lucky enough to get a small number of new members who have already made a wonderful contribution. But since then we have lost other members.

We really need a few more people to help us deal with the growing number of calls for assistance. If we could get half a dozen new members that would make a big difference.

So I'd love you to think about whether you have the time to join us, or at least find out a bit more about what we do. Members of the parish Conference will be out the front of the church after weekend Masses on 11 and 12 May, so why not say hello?

What is involved in being a member?

Attending a meeting once a fortnight on a Tuesday at 7pm for about an hour;

- Making yourself available to work with another member in dealing with the calls for assistance that come in on a particular day, which might take 2 hours;
- Calls can be dealt with during the day or evening depending on what suits.

Working With Vulnerable People

Because of the type of work we do with vulnerable members of the community, members are required to obtain a Working With Vulnerable People card from Access Canberra and have a police check done, which can be organised through the St Vincent de Paul Head Office at Yarralumla.

In Conclusion

I really hope you will consider joining us. When the time comes we would like to think that we are able to say that we fed the hungry, we gave drink to the thirsty and we clothed the naked.

Entrance Antiphon | Acts of the Apostles 1:11

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

First Reading | Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

ay we are all to come to unity in our faith and in our knowledge of the Son of God, until we become the perfect Man, fully mature with the fullness of Christ himself.
